STOP PRESS - ANOTHER JOWETT CLUB VICTORY

John coffee fitted a prototype set of solid tappets to his car and is extremely pleased with the results. His oil pressure rose from 15 lbs/sq in., to 55 lbs/sq in., with engine hot. No apparent increase in noise was noticed.

I would advise anyone fitting tappets to contact John Coffee if in doubt regards fitting procedure. Anyway make sure the engine is hot before attempting to remove old tappets or fit new ones, do one side at a time preferably.

CURING CLUTCH JUDDER

Javelin Modification, No. 3

Many cars (including Javelins) suffer at some stage from clutch judder which may vary from a slight shiver on engagement, to the condition where the car is almost undriveable and severe stresses are set up throughout the transmission.

The initial cause of the trouble is often not in the clutch itself. It may be due to slackness anywhere between the front engine mountings and the rear suspension. Hoverer, once started, the initial impulse builds up into a series of jerks caused by fore and aft movement, of the engine and gearbox reacting with the clutch control linkage which is attached at one end to the chassis. It follows that, if this engine movement, can be prevented without unduly affecting the flexibility of its mounting, the clutch judder can be largely overcome.

Your Technical Committee has found that, in the Javelin, fore and aft engine movement is permitted by lack of stiffness in the rear engine mounting bracket and its connection with the chassis cross member. The following modification has been found effective in preventing judder:

PARTS REQUIRED:

- a) One Renault Dauphine front anti-roll bar link Part No, 754 D3 Price 32/6 plus tax.
- b) Two bolts 3/8 x 2-in. with nuts and spring washers.
- c) 14-in. length of 1¹/₄-in. x ¹/₄-in. mild steel flat.

The parts are fitted as shown in the sketch. The mild steel bar is cut up into four pieces, two of 2-in. length and two of 5-in. length, Each pair is clamped together and a $\frac{3}{8}$ -in. diam. hole drilled through. The exact position of the holes should be found by trial fitting on the car and they should be so placed that the link does not foul the gearbox or cross member. The distance between the holes should be equal to the distance between the eyes of the link.

The distance between the plates of each pair should be equal to the length of the inner bushes of the link. When welding, the plates should be clamped together with spacers of the correct thickness between them. Arc welding should be used, and if the plates a:re to be welded to the gearbox while it is in place, excessive heat should be avoided.

The Renault link has bushes of metric size fractionally smaller than 3/8-in. These will need to be cleaned out with a 3/8-in. drill or reamer before fitting. The bolts through the bushes should be fully tightened and should pinch the bushes between the plates. The rubber bushes in the link will allow all necessary movement.

As with other modifications issued by the Club, there is no point in going to the trouble and expense of flitting this link unless you are having trouble.

Time enough to face it if and when it comes.
