MOST IMPORTANT

As is probably well known, one of the principle causes of anxiety for owners of Javelin cars, is the prospect of crankshaft breakage, together with its attendant difficulties in obtaining a replacement, in addition to the excessive price of this item, if and when available.

The Club is now in a position to overcome this trouble. It has arranged for the production in Australia, of a crankshaft, which it is felt, will completely overcome the faults encountered on the early type.

No more can be said at this stage, as a pilot model has to be manufactured, and thoroughly tested, but please keep it in mind that such a shaft will be available early in the new, year, at a very reasonable price.

It will be of an oval web design, similar to the Laystall type, which has proved so successful in quite a number of Javelin cars.

SPARE PARTS

George Gilmore has stocks of various parts required for modification kits, and other parts as detailed below.

Would members please note, that a charge of one shilling in the pound, (Value), will be added to parts cost, to cover packing and despatch, and a further fee of 1s/4d will be charged for registration of parcels or packages. I think all will agree that this 1s a reasonable request, since it safeguards your interests.

PARTS AVAILABLE

DOOR HANDLES – Cast in Bronze 18/- plus postage and registration. Total cost £1-0-0.

TIMING CHAINS – The latest prices paid by the Club on these chains has risen somewhat. They will now be available to members at £1-0-0 each plus one shilling postage and 1s/4d registration, making a Total of £1-2-4.

SOLID TAPPETS – Stocks of these are now finished. Any members requiring tappets are requested to place an order with a deposit of £3-0-0, so that a collective order may be placed with the engineering firm concerned. The total price of the tappets is £6-0-0 per set, plus postage and registration. Total price £6-7-4.

JAVELIN REPAIR SCHEME No 2. – This kit for converting the front suspension to rubber bushes is now available, contact George Gilmore for further particulars.

GEARBOX MODIFICATION KIT No. 1. – Consisting of full roller bearings for cluster pinions and spigot, and a new gear operating shaft, this kit is a must for anyone with the engine down. It could save many pounds, at some later date. The kit is priced at £3-0-0 plus postage and registration, a total of £3-1-4, and Is now available.

CARBURETTOR CHANGE OVER SERVICE – Two 30 VM-5 type units have been completely reconditioned, and are now available to members, on a change over basis. The cost of this service has been fixed at £7-0-0 per pair plus freight, a total of £7-8-0. It will be necessary to order these carburettors, together with remittance, upon receipt of which, they will be despatched at once to the member. Please note the units removed from car must be sent back in container to Mr. Gilmore, 4 Thompson Street, ORMOND, as soon as possible after the receipt of the change over units, so that they may be sent in for reconditioning.

Damaged units will be repaired, but the additional cost of these repairs must be charged to the member.

RECORDS HELD BY JOWETT CARS

Having whetted your appetite, here are some more startling facts – go easy on those shafts fellows.

JAVELIN 1949 1st Spa 24 Hour Race.

1st Rheeneck-Wat Senhausen Hill Climb.

JAVELIN 1950 1st Alpine Rally Of The Snows. This race run at night over 425 miles, was icy and dangerous, the Javelin was the only car to lose no points out of the 190 cars entered.

JAVELIN 1950 1st Belgian 24 Hour Grand Prix. The car in this race covered 1,500 miles in the 24 hours at an average speed of 65·5 mph.

JAVELIN 1950 1st and 3rd Placings, Monte Carlo Rally

JUPITOR 1950 1st Le Mans, the car covered 2,000 miles at an average speed of 76·5 mph and developed 64 B.H.P. on a compression ratio of 8·5 to 1.

JUPITOR 1951 1st Le Mans, this was the mighty R1 type machine, with a compression ratio of 9.25 to 1.

JUPITOR 1951 1st and 2nd placings T.T. Race 1951.

JUPITOR 1952 1st Le Mans, modified R1 Type. Same ratio but with a rear axle ratio changed to 4·1 to 1 in lieu of 4·56 to 1 last year.
