OIL COOLING

Mr. Taylor mentioned in the last issue of the 'News', that he had fitted cooling tubes to the sump of his car. I have also had this modification fitted, and have noticed a reduction in oil temperature of some 5 to 10 degrees.

This is monitored on my car, by means of a block type 'Thermistor', fitted to the rear of the sump, any resistance variations caused by temperature change, are indicated by a panel mounted meter.

Like John, I have not yet fitted rams to the intake hoses, and it is expected that these will result in a greater dissipation of heat, with a consequent lower operating temperature. Trials are still proceeding, and it is hoped ultimately to be able to produce a changeover sump, fitted with tubes, hoses and intake rams, to be used on car's that are driven somewhat harder than normal, or on long trips.

An oil radiator, as was fitted to the late model Javelin and Jupitors, is of course the complete answer, but these are rather expensive, are in the main pressure line, and are hard to fit to car's fitted with the Vokes type oil filter.

Under these circumstances, the simple method as detailed above, seems promising. Any members with ideas concerning oil cooling, should contact the Club.

CONCLUSION

Rather late I know, but the Executive Committee would like to take at this opportunity, to wish all members, a very happy and prosperous 1960, with safe and troublefree motoring. Drive safely, and carefully, thus reducing the ever increasing road toll.
