NEW IDEAS FOR 1961

Your Technical Committee have quite a few new ideas which should be available next year, namely an oil cooler of some description, considered a must in our summer climate. We notice that the 'Borgward' people have seen fit to install a cooler on their flat four, the Tiger Hansa, for precisely the same reasons we have for the Javelin. The bearing loading on a flat four engine, coupled with the rather small sump area does result in extremely high temperatures being generated. Try touching the oil filter after a nice long run on a summers day, have some butter handy for the burn though.

Another feature which will be made available, is a new approach to water sealing the engine, ending once and for all the frustrations caused by water entering the plug holes. As a matter of fact we recently received a suggestion from a Tasmanian member dealing with this same fault, and this will be printed in the next issue of this letter.

Due to lower subscription rates, it will not be possible for the Club to finance the manufacture of any of the parts now offered to members, let alone go ahead with new ideas. Fortunately we have the assurance of Jupitor Engineering Co., who will look after the Club's interest in these fields.
