TECHNICAL DATA FROM JOWETTS

We have had so many queries for the reconditioned crankshafts, mentioned in the last issue, what an attempt to clarify the position does seem warranted. The articles which we are printing are in fact copied from information got out by the Jowett factory some year's ago, detailing all the modifications made to the car from it's inception, to the time production ceased. Reconditioned shafts are available in England, but not I'm afraid, out here. Actually there is no part whatsoever which cannot be purchased 'over the counter', in England, I wish too when this was the case here in Australia, but there you are, we must make the best of what we do have, and we do not do too badly for parts, both as to availability, and price, compared to some makes of car selling in this country. Anyway now you know, those articles refer to original Jowett data, not nescessarily to what this Club produces.

PARTS

To those members who are still patiently awaiting our solid tappetts, we do expect delivery of our order in some weeks time, provided that the manufacturer does not delay us any further, this will be covered in later orders, to prevent the long delays which has occurred in this one. I would suggest that any member wanting a set of these tappetts, advise G. Gilmore, so that he has all the names ready.

We have received a shipment of spares from England, mainly small items not available here, I will draw up a list, together with prices, and this will be published in the next News. The items are briefly as follows . . . Breather Vent Valves, Oil Filler Caps, Rebound rubbers, front and rear, an oil cooler set with pipes, and sundry other items. It will be appreciated that this was a trial order only, to ascertain if it would be economical, and practical way to obtain spares. Fortunately Messrs Hercules Motors in Sydney do carry good stocks of the more usual lines. TECHNICAL

Re Water Proofing Javelin Engine

We are indebted to Mr. Neville Poynter of Hobart, for the modification notes to follow. We ourselves have not actually tried this scheme, but it appears to be a very satisfactory method.

Materials Required:

1%-in. M.S. Washers4 offVW Plug Connections4 offVW Rubber Plug Grommets4 off

EPISTOP 2 Tube Adhesive

Method:

- 1. Skim out the internal diameter of the washers to exactly 1¼-in.
- 2. Clean up cylinder head top covers surrounding plug holes down to bare metal.
- 3. Attach washers with 'Epistop', (as directed), central to the plug electrode. Allow 48 hours to cure if possible.
- 4. Waterproof the joint face between cylinder head top cover, and the head proper, being particularly careful to make watertight.
- 5. Bond the plug leads to the distributor cover with PC-49. Make rubber boot for distributor from suitable diameter inner tubing.
- 6. Assemble with new H.T. leads, and check fitting of VW grommets, etc.
- 7. Trim inner edge of cylinder top cover plug holes with half-round file if nescessary.

Note: It is possible that the outer diameter of the washers should 1%-in. Also Steps 5 and 6 should be transposed? The VW is the Beetle of the period.

JAVELIN - TECHNICAL INFORMATION

Date of Issue: No Date Provided From JOWETT CARS LIMITED

Item No. 8: Front Brakes

'Grabbing' or Judder' on the front brakes may be caused by the following:

- 1. Incorrect adjustment, allowing excessive clearance between the brake lining and the drum.
- 2. Brake linings insecurely or incorrectly rivetted to the shoes.
- 3. Brake shoe pivot pin loose on the back plate.
- 4. Irregularities in the surface of the brake drum bore.

It is possible that, even with the above points correct, grabbing may occur and in this case, the existing linings should be replaced with Mintex M14J linings.

Item No. 9: Air Vent Filter Felt (PB List Item 27 – Part No. 52244)

If the tappet cover air vent filter felts are not cleaned or replaced at approximately 10,000 miles (16,000 kms) or more frequently if necessary, there is a danger of them becoming blocked causing excessive crankcase depression. Owners should, therefore, be advised to have this service carried out.

With the air vents blocked, this depression is likely to be so great that the operation of the petrol pump diaphragm is neutralised, causing engine 'fade out'.

Maximum depression occurs at approximately 2,500 RPM (40 MPH - 64 KPH) at which speed it should not exceed approximately $\frac{3}{4}$ -in. (19 mm) lift using a mercury gauge or 10-in. (20.5 cm) using a water gauge.

A copper pipe sweated into a spare oil filler cap can conveniently be used when coupling the depression gauge to the crankcase.

Item No. 10: Recommended Lubricants

When servicing Javelin cars, please advise owners that the following lubrication recommendations supersede those shown in their PA and PB instruction books.

Item No. 11: Spare Wheel Carrier (Standard PB)

Under certain conditions there is a possibility that the spare wheel carrier will foul the rear brake compensator. From Javelin No. E0/PB 8145 the rear portion of the carrier has been removed and a reinforcing strap has been substituted.

Should this condition be experienced on oars before No. E0/PB 8145 the carrier may be modified as shown on the sketch below.
