HAND-WRITTEN JOTTINGS

Did you know that in 1949 Javelins won their class in the Monte Carlo rally, and repeated the performance again in 1951 with Jupiters first and second and Javelin fourth. In 1952 another class win and fifth outright. Class wins again in 1953 and 1954, altogether rather a good effort.

In 1949 a perfectly standard Javelin won the 2-litre touring class of a Belgium 24-hour race.

In 1950 a Jupiter won the 1½-litre Le Mans 24-hr Grand Prix d'Endurance, breaking the course record to finish 17th overall. 1951 saw another class win, and again in 1952.

In 1951 a Jupiter was first in general classification (Lisbon Rally) and 1½-litre class. A Jupiter won the 1½-litre class of the Bremgarten Sports car race. A Jupiter won the 1½-litre class of the Rheinech|Walzenhauses Hill Climb. A Jupiter or Javelin was first in general classification in the Rallye de L'Iseran. Jowetts were first and second in the R.A.C. Towrist Trophy Race 1½-litre class. A Jupiter won the 1½-litre race at Watkins Glen. U.S.A.

While these results look well they are but a few of Jowetts success and only those which I was able to find tonight when I found the urge to print the newsletter.

One I almost forgot was a win by a Javelin in the 1953 Tulip Rally outright and the best performance on formula in a British Economy run with 67·9 M.P.G.

Then of course there is Miles Friederich right here in Melbourne who races a Javelin special which has been clocked at 120 M.P.H. using his small set of tyres. Miles has moderately tuned his motor to produce 95 B.H.P. on test with remarkable torque.

The next social event will be the A.O.M.C.C. Sprint Meeting to be held at calder Racewayon, or rather, just off the Calder Highway. I am told the venue is easy to find near the 16 mile post.
